- List 3 reasons exotic cats DON'T make good pets. Here's another resource 🐱.
 - 1.) Cats are impulsive, they can and will strike at you if you do the wrong things at the wrong time. You must be able to read a cat's body language (eye's, how it walks, speed of its movements, sounds, movement of tail, position of head, how it approaches and how it responds).
 - 2.) Instincts are to lock on and stalk smaller of any species.
 - 3.) Require large living space (i.e. lions & tigers 4500 square feet). Tigers and jaguars require a pool for swimming and cooling off. The average habitat costs \$30,000.
